CANCELLATIONS



Below are two Huon Pine bedside tables with matching birdseye fronted drawers and a slatted shelf for slippers, etc., made by Lex VanSaane

The drawer fronts were from the one piece of wood cut carefully through so the birdseye matched. After advice from UBeaut on how to keep the Huon Pine colour and not have it go brown over time, the finish was sanded to 800 grit, a coat of de-waxed white shellac applied, re-sanded to 1500 grit, then EEE applied. They feel great to the touch. Hopefully another nice family heirloom!

ACCESSING RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS

National cabinet has agreed to provide up to 10 free rapid antigen tests for concession card holders over the next three months.

Government concession card holders will be able to access up to 10 free rapid antigen tests from pharmacies over a 3 month period (max 5 in a month), including:

- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card
- Department of Veteran's Affairs Gold, White or Orange Card
- Health Care Card Low Income Health Card
- Pensioner Concession Card.

The subsidised tests will be available in the next

SAFETY IS NO ACCIDENT

Protect your eyes! You need them to see with....

We have started a new year and are getting back into the well established routines that we all love. Unfortunately one of the most important aspects of working in a workshop with heavy machinery tends to take a 'back seat' in our minds - this is the issue of safety and appropriate PPE - We all need to be diligent when it comes to safety, not just for ourselves but also for others.



Eye protection in my opinion is the most frequently forgotten item of PPE. There are safety glasses at both grinders in the turning room but so often they are not used. It takes only a few

seconds to don the glasses and prevent a piece of hot steel taking up residence in your eye and possibly causing blindness.

Do yourselves a favour and use the glasses supplied, or bring your own along.

It is perfectly OK to pull up a member for not for doing the right thing, indeed it is everyone's obligation to make sure your fellow woodworkers are safe. If you see someone doing the wrong thing, "Say Something".
