News from your President, Clinton Luckock

AGM is done for the year and the key points for those that were not able to attend are –

- Cosgrove H S lease finally signed off for the period ending on 31 March 2022
- Committee changes Brian Ridler and John Grubb have retired from the committee after many years of dedicated service, Brian for 20 years and John for 13 years.
- President Clinton Luckock, Vice President John Penprase,
- Secretary Ken Dowling, Treasurer Tom Black
- Committee members George Harris, Rod Daly, Murray Jessup and Kerry Fraser
- Two Guild committee positions available for any member who could give a little extra time to the Club and attend many of the eleven committee meetings.
- 6 new members have joined the Guild in the past year and considering the turmoil over the year with COVID and the school fire shut down for 3 months, this is a great outcome.
- Woodturning classes commenced in June and are well attended and attracting new members
- Health & Safety system improvements have been implemented to meet our insurance provider's requirements and there are more to come

Clinton attended the Tasmanian Men's shed Association (TMSA) AGM on 19 August 2021.

- New TMSA Committee elected
- TMSA grant funding has been increased to \$175,000 per annum
- New Hobart Central Men's Shed is in the planning phase for construction latter this year on land offered by the C3 Church in Anglesea Street, South Hobart. Funding through Rotary and others has been secured and this will be a very substantial Men's Shed and well worth a look when it is operational.
- Good discussions were held with a number of representatives of the various Men's Sheds

Looking forward

The Cosgrove High School is planning major upgrades to the school in 2022 with a budget of \$20 million allocated by the Tasmanian Government. Final plans are expected by the end of this year. With the delay in sign off of the rental agreement for the Guild workshop and the current rental term ending on 31 March 2022 it is prudent that we investigate alternative locations which could be suitable for relocating the Guild should it become necessary. The Guild Committee has agreed that this course of action is warranted and so we will be reaching out to the TMSA for assistance and approaching Council's and local politicians to see if there are any good options available to us. There is no guarantee that we will find a suitable option or that we will be able to secure another year of use of our current location, but we feel it necessary to investigate any potential options in case it is required. Any viable findings will be brought back to the committee for review and updates provided to all members.

The first woodturning course with 4 members has finished and the second course commenced on 26 August with 5 members. There is a plan for another course for members in October and there are a few on the waiting list now so don't delay, if you are interested let John know asap.

Member Health & Safety (H&S) inductions and sign off on the use of Guild equipment has commenced so if you wish to get signed off to use any of the Guild equipment please contact the Guild H&S Assessors Kerry Fraser and John Penprase to organise a suitable time. The members attending the woodturning classes will be signed off on the use of wood lathes and bandsaws as part of the curriculum.

The Guild committee continues to work on workshop visits and guest speakers.

 Brian Ridler has offered to open his workshop for members to visit at 4.00pm on 23 November 2021 at 3 Tranmere Road, Howrah.

There are several other events in the planning phase that will be emailed out to all members as soon as the details are finalised.

Vin Smith - Halls Machinery

At the July meeting George Harris talked about the life and impact of Vin on wood workers and turners in Tasmania. Vin was a unique character, in today's overused adjectives iconic and passionate! He even persuaded some of his customers to establish our Hobart based Woodcraft Guild of Tasmania. Vin ran a very successful business in Warwick St and was lucky to employ Claire Miller who could manage Vin and the tools & machinery which packed the building. Old woodworking machinery, driven by feet or hands, fascinated Vin and he bought many rare pieces which with help from Guild members were established in the mid 1990's as the Vin Smith Collection, in the old Geeveston Town Hall.

George has provided links to an excellent interview he provided at ABC Radio Hobart and also a photograph taken at the Collection in Geeveston, showing Melissa Smith, Arts Tas, Launceston, Sue Brezinscak, Huon Valley Council and Claire Miller, now a spritely eighty five old.


