News from your President, Clinton Luckock

2021 has been a very busy year with interesting speakers at meetings, great events, workshop visits, sharing of skills and knowledge through demonstrations, special interest groups, show and tell and general discussions amongst members. These included demonstrations of sharpening, wood identification, wood screws & uses, walking stick making, CNC routing, 3D printing, laser engraving, woodturning, router tips & tricks, etc.

The monthly highlights of 2021 were:

January

- BBQ at Crawleighwood Gardens, Nicholls Rivulet
- Receipt of the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association (TMSA) grant for \$4,962

February

- Purchase of two new wood lathes, additional turning tools and a dust air filter with funds provided by the TSMA grant.
- Safe Operating Procedures introduced for the Guild equipment

March

- A visit to VOS Constructions Kingston workshop to see their 5 axis CNC router in operation on 18th March.
- A visit to Murray Jessup's home workshop at Sandy Bay followed by a meal at Dr Syntax Hotel on $23^{\rm rd}$ March
- Guild members operated a demonstration stand at the Vintage Machinery Society Heritage Farming Expo at Cambridge on 27th and 28th March

April

- A visit to the Denman Marine workshop at Kettering on Saturday 17th April, a very interesting display of Tasmania's boat building skills.

May

- A visit to Duncan Meerding's workshop in North Hobart on 27th May at which Simeon Dux from Melbourne spoke about skills development for the visually impaired. Simeon was judged as the 2020 Maker of the Year by the Australian Wood Review.

June

- A visit to Michael Gaskell's workshop and the Broadmarsh Fire Brigade Station on 5th June
- The first member Health & Safety inductions and sign off on the use of Guild equipment on 12th June 2021.
- Commencement of the first woodturning class 17th June conducted by John Penprase.

July

- Gosgrove High School signed a short lease with the Guild for our Club room until 31 March 2022.
- Routers and jigs with tips and tricks described or demonstrated by members

August

- A display of members work was organised and arranged by Trevor Semmens at the Rosny Library display from 2nd to 27th August
- The Guild Annual General Meeting was held on the 10th August
- President Clinton attended the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association AGM on 19th August at Longford.
- Second woodturning class commenced on 26th August

September

- A visit to the Veterans Workshop at Dowsing Point on 14th September

October

- Guild members conducted a very popular activity helping children to make about 600 'Boats & Planes' at the shortened Royal Hobart Show from 21st to 23rd October.
- Third woodturning class commenced on 28th October
- An application submitted to the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association for their 2022 club grants

November

- A visit to Brian Ridler's workshop and BBQ on 23rd November
- The Health & Safety Sub-committee renewed the Guild Safety Policy, Workshop Safety Procedure, Incident Reporting form and a Guild Induction Procedure.

December

- President Clinton attended the Cosgrove High School final assembly on 10th December to present a student prize on behalf of the Guild
- Christmas Dinner at the Black Buffalo 14th December

The Guild was successful in its application to the Tasmanian Men's Shed Association (TMSA) Grants Program 2021-22 and will receive funding of \$3 645 for tools and equipment. These funds will be spent on a Laguna C-Flux mobile cyclone dust extraction unit and a second Carbatec dust filter, which could be very useful resources if our Club room lease is not renewed.

What can Guild members expect in 2022?

The major issue is uncertainty about the renewal of the lease for our Club room. Your Committee is working to resolve some options if the lease is not renewed so we hope it will not be an 'interesting' year!
